Stephanie will give a talk on local Native American culture, traditional weaving and tools, and plants and their uses. Following her talk, she will teach a short workshop on working with tule to create a Tule Duck Decoy, used by many tribes for hunting.

Stephanie Craig is a traditional basket weaver and a member of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. She grew up listening to stories of her family's weaving traditions. Stephanie feels it is important to preserve and pass down her people's history and cultural practices, as a weaver and a teacher.

Stephanie has a BA in Cultural Anthropology and an MA in Cultural Anthropology, Museum Studies, and Folklore Studies.
